### English in Year 6

English throughout Year 6 covers the following:

- Reading
- Writing
- Grammar
- Punctuation
- Spelling
- Handwriting



## **Reading in Year 6**



- Develop reading stamina (100 150 words per minute)
- Vocabulary, deduction and inference
- Test type questioning through a variety of books and genres
- Develop reading habits and widen reading preferences throughout the year.





### Writing in Year 6



- To analyse and unpick different text types
- Plan and compose a variety of texts which are appropriate to audience and purpose
- To evaluate, edit and improve work



#### Grammar and Punctuation

- Recognise vocabulary and structures that are appropriate to form
- Use and understand key grammatical terminology (active, passive synonym, antonym)
- Indicate grammatical and other features in writing (commas, hyphens, colons, etc...)



- To further consolidate rules of prefixes and suffixes
- To further embed key rules, patterns and conventions
- Learn the statutory word list for Years 5 and 6.



## Handwriting



- Write legibly and fluently in joint handwriting
- Write with increasing speed
- Choose the appropriate handwriting style which is fit for purpose i.e. note taking, publishing, etc..









In Year 6 we use 'Maths no Problem' as a basis for our lessons.

This ensures children increase their confidence and fluency in:

- Arithmetic
- Reasoning
- Problem Solving
- Using mathematical language





#### Maths in Year 6



Maths throughout Year 6 covers the following:

- Place value reading, writing and ordering numbers
- Rounding numbers
- Using negative numbers in context
- The four operations addition, subtraction, multiplication and division
- Fractions, decimals and percentages

- Solving problems in different contexts






#### **Science in Year 6**

- Survival of the Fittest








- To inspire a sense of excitement and curiosity about the world around us




#### **Thematic Curriculum**



We love to celebrate big and small successes. Year 6 rewards include:


