Our Value for this half term is Forgiveness...



This week, children took part in our first assembly exploring the theme of forgiveness. We began by thinking about an important question: How do you mend a broken friendship? To help us reflect, we listened to the Bible story of The Unforgiving Servant, which teaches that we should show others the same forgiveness that we have been shown. The children thought about times they have been forgiven, and whether there might be someone they need to forgive.

We used the symbols of mirrors and doors to guide our thinking.

- Mirrors encouraged the children to reflect on their own feelings, actions, and what God might be teaching them.
 - Doors reminded us that forgiveness isn't just a thought—it's something we do. We step out and show kindness, care, and understanding in our words and actions.
- As a school community, we explored how forgiveness helps us to thrive together by making our classrooms calmer, safer, and happier places to learn.

We ended with a prayer, asking for help to forgive others, choose peace, and build positive relationships each day.
